

#### Long Beach Nonfarm Employment





#### Taxable Sales: Long Beach, County & State








## Office Vacancy Rates: LA County & South Bay Submarket




#### Retail Vacancy Rates: Long Beach v. County




#### Industrial Vacancy Rate: Long Beach v. County




#### Apartment Rent Growth Rates by Area




#### Apartment Vacancy Rates by Area


