

Fieldwork in Psychology Application



Course Description

This course provides Psychology majors with internship and professional development opportunities in the field. Students are assisted in locating a psychology-related internship and are expected to complete 90 hours at their internship by the end of the semester (about 6 hours per week). Students are also expected to attend class where they will learn professional development skills such as soft-skills, ethics, self-care, and career planning. Grading is on a Credit/No Credit basis.

Admission Criteria

Admission to the class is by application only. To qualify for admission, students must be Psychology majors who have completed at least 12 upper division units and have a GPA of at least 3.0 (both overall and in Psychology) by the first day of class. Enrollment is capped at 15 students per section and preference is given to students with well-articulated goals and reasons for taking the class. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis during the registration period or until the class is full.
