In order to graduate from CSULB, students must complete General Education/GWAR/Major requirements and have a minimum of 120 units (40 must be upper division) with at least a 2.0 in all GPAs (Overall, CSULB, Major).

- A course can only be used to satisfy one minor requirement. Double counting is not allowed within the minor.
- Students must achieve intermediate competency in Spanish equivalent to SPAN 200, 201B, or SPAN 250 prior to enrolling in upper division coursework. The total number of lower division units depends on the student's existing language competency and can range from 0 to 16 units depending on placement. Students should consult with the undergraduate advisor regarding demonstration of existing language competency.
- Students must file a Declaration of Minor and receive counseling from the undergraduate Spanish advisors. The minor in Spanish is open to any non-Spanish major.
- No course used to satisfy any requirement for the Minor in Spanish may be taken on a Credit/No Credit basis (Exceptions: AP/IB credit).
